Countermeasures against infectious diseases related to the new Coronavirus

Regarding students going abroad and international students coming to Japan

As for COVID-19, it remains difficult to travel from Japan to other countries (e.g., the Ministry of Foreign Affairs has issued an infectious disease risk level of 2 or higher), however, some countries have begun preparations to accept students from abroad.

Under these circumstances, please take the following measures regarding students going abroad and international students coming to Japan.

1, About students going abroad

- 1) Students are not allowed to go abroad until the end of the first semester (end of August).
- 2) Regarding going abroad for the purpose of training and study abroad after the end of the first semester (after September 1), students can travel to countries where the risk of infectious disease information from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs is "Level 1" or the information has not been issued. However, before going abroad, it is necessary to confirm the status of their destination, submit the report of temporary leave and a written pledge. Therefore, before a dispatch project is implemented, please be sure to contact the following contact information and obtain their approval.
- 3) For private travel, the current strong self-restraint request (no travel) will continue even after September 1.

If you must go to your home country, please make sure to consult with the following contact information in advance.

2, About International students coming to Japan (Acceptance of new students scheduled to enroll in October and international students who have not been able to come to Japan)

- 1) The student must be from a country or region where the risk of infectious disease information from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs is level 1 or no such information has been issued.
- 2) In principle, it is assumed that international students will enter Japan around September 15. However, there are certain things to keep in mind, such as a 14 days voluntary health observation period. The university will contact you, so please follow the instructions and come to Japan. Please note that the above information may be subject to change depending on the situation in Japan and abroad. Therefore, please keep an eye out for upcoming notices and information from the University.
